Our core programs

We offer a wide array of no-cost programs to our members, all of whom farm in our local community (focusing on the Rush River watershed, but encompassing the Kinnickinnic and Willow River watersheds as well). These programs are often updated each year, but examples are:

• Research Projects:

- Regular well testing and analysis of water quality (in partnership with UW-River Falls)
- Regular soil testing in support of nutrient management planning
- Ongoing study of ground and surface water movement in various soil types

• Educational Projects:

- Annual field day events focused on promoting best conservation practices
- Annual member meeting to collect member experience and publicize research findings
- Systematic nutrient management training, by/for farmers

• Community Awareness Projects:

- Ongoing participation in adjacent watershed and related conservation groups
- Promotion of conservation across our member counties
- Direct involvement in educational and media events in support of WWCC

• Financial Support Projects:

- Annual cost-share programs to support conservation practices
- Incentive programs for first-time cover crop users
- Soil and water testing cost-share program for all members
